Daylight savings is next Sunday, Nov. 2, and it is also the first Sunday of the month. Be mindful of planning out your schedules!

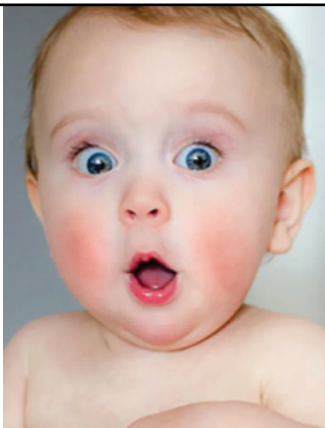


NEW PARISH DIRECTORY: SAMPLES OUT NOW!
